

What can parents do to support the placement?

Attend planned meetings for their child.

Share relevant information.

Continue to support positive relationships with their child's mainstream school. (most children return to their mainstream school)

Ensure pupils attends HIVE on their designated days and during their designated times.

Apply shared strategies, techniques and support from the HIVE team.

Attend mid-point and end of provision meetings with the HIVE team and mainstream school.

HIVE InReach, DSPL 6 Primary Behaviour Provision

HIVE is a separate provision hosted by Summerswood Primary School
Please note admissions to HIVE are not through Summerswood Primary School

HIVE, DSPL 6 Primary Behaviour Provision

InReach Placement

HIVE is the DSPL 6 Primary Behaviour Provision which offers early intervention by experienced staff to support the Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs, including behaviour, for pupils, their families and local schools.



What is the local HIVE offer?

The Tiered Approach of support that HIVE follow aligns to the Hertfordshire Emotional, Wellbeing and Behaviour Strategy.

Universal and Universal Plus (Tier 1 and 2)

Individual School's responsibilities to meet SEND need within the mainstream school.

Targeted support (Tier 3)

Individual School's responsibilities to offer some children more targeted support within a mainstream school. However, some pupils' may need help from outside agencies. For children, Year 1-6, who need something more individual to meet their needs, as well as support from outside agencies there is: **HIVE Outreach support**; six sessions of provision. Small group or individual.

Observation, advice and strategies slots regarding individuals, small groups or whole classes.

Targeted Plus (Tier 4)

Those children, Year 1-6 who need intensive support in a smaller environment for a short period. **HIVE InReach short-term schooling**; usually twelve weeks.

Specialist (Tier 5)

For pupils where a managed move instead of permanent exclusion is sought. Also provision from Day 6 in cases of permanent exclusion until the Governors Discretionary Committee hearing there is:

HIVE InReach placement.

HIVE InReach, 12 week short-term schooling provision

HIVE Statement of Intent: HIVE InReach offers pupils access to a balanced academic and nurturing curriculum across their short-term schooling placement supporting their behaviour development in order for them to return to their mainstream settings with greater self-esteem, social skills, confidence and a more positive role within their school community.

What does HIVE provision look like?

- Dual registration between mainstream school and **HIVE**
- Schooling within the **HIVE** rooms
- Support available for pupils Yr. 1 to 6
- Holistic support based on identified needs from EHCPs, Therapeutic Thinking paperwork, referral forms, school and parent information and HIVE observations.
- Routine of learning
- Attendance based on individual need.
- Higher ratio of adults (not 1:1)
- Termly parent/carer consultations
- Mid-placement review meetings
- Transition support towards the end of the placement and for the term afterwards

What mainstream schools will do to support the placement?

School to send signed referral forms to the HIVE team.

Attend weekly contact meetings between mainstream school, identified pupil and **HIVE**.

Regularly visit the pupil on placement: to maintain relationships, seek professional development through, identify strategies that HIVE are using to support the pupil

Be involved in transition work including maintaining relationships with peers and staff.

Have an identified staff member to support the pupil upon their return to their mainstream school

Attend mid-point and end of provision meetings with the HIVE team and apply the end of provision report in supporting the pupils return to school.
