HIVE OutReach

HIVE Outreach will work with pupils and schools to develop understanding and acknowledgement of feelings and behaviours, through shared strategies and knowledge, enabling pupils to be successful within their setting.



HIVE InReach

HIVE InReach offers pupils access to a social, emotional and mental health focused curriculum, with some academic learning, across their short-term schooling placement supporting their behaviour development in order for them to return to their mainstream settings with greater self-esteem, social skills, confidence and a more positive view as themselves as learners.

HIVE is the DSPL 6 Primary Behaviour Provision which offers intervention by experienced staff to support the Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs, including behaviour, for pupils, their families and local schools. The Tiered Approach of support that HIVE follow aligns to the Hertfordshire Emotional, Wellbeing and Behaviour Strategy, with outreach support at Tiers 3 and InReach provision at Tiers 4 and 5. HIVE aligns with the Hertfordshire Outcome Bees framework to support pupils and their families.	Universal and Universal Plus (Tier 1 and 2) School responsibility to meet SEND need within the setting making available provision from the Hertfordshire Ordinarily Available Provision document. Targeted support (Tier 3) School responsibility to offer some children more targeted support within the setting. Some pupils’ may need help from outside agencies. For children, Year 1-6, who need something more individual to meet their needs, as well as support from outside agencies HIVE can offer: HIVE Outreach support; minimum of 4 sessions of individual support. (from Spring 2027) Observation, advice and strategies slots regarding individuals, small groups or whole classes. HIVE host the DSPL 6 Solution Clusters – This offers solution focused reflective practise for Year 1-6 pupil/s within a mainstream school. It happens every half term and is conducted online with access to advice from a variety of local professionals. HIVE InReach short-term schooling; usually twelve weeks. Specialist (Tier 5) For pupils where a managed move instead of permanent exclusion is sought. Also provision from Day 6 in cases of permanent exclusion until the Governors Discretionary Committee hearing there is: HIVE InReach placement. B- Belong E – Engage E – Empower These sessions are to support the reintegration of pupils back into their mainstream settings with the opportunity to have continued HIVE support during this process. It will also be an opportunity for a re-connect for pupils who have previously had HIVE InReach support and may need some resettling sessions. More information will be sent nearer the time. NEW – From Autumn 2026 HIVE are introducing parent/carer and child engagement sessions. We value the partnership between parents/carers and HIVE and will be supporting valued interactions and communications through fun and collaborative sessions. NEW – From Autumn 2026 HIVE will be offering Friday afternoon BEE-CONNECTED visits. The HIVE team visits will offer a continuation of advice and strategies in a child’s mainstream school whilst dual registered throughout their InReach placement. This is the effective inclusion of all children within the school community. Focusing on positive behaviour management for all pupils and staff. Schools are able to access, download, refer to and implement the expectations outlined within the Hertfordshire Ordinarily Available Provision document.	At a targeted level, HIVE will look to build capacity across local DSPL 6 primary schools by sharing good practise and drawing on the knowledge and experience within the local area. Training and sharing Best practise HIVE will support opportunities to develop the confidence of colleagues in supporting pupils with SEMH needs through training and sharing best practise across the area. Dates and times will be agreed and sent out. HIVE will work with local DSPL 6 schools to support children who need something more individual to meet their needs. Every half term Solution Cluster slots are for support for pupils Year 1-6. How it will look: • In person meeting with parents/carers and schools prior to support beginning where an agreed target or areas for support are discussed. • Individual sessions will be planned and delivered. • Building capacity for individual pupils, parents and schools through plans, advice and strategies on site and weekly feedback with responsibilities for schools and parents to implement. • This will be a minimum of 4 sessions of support • Support available for pupils Yr. 1 to 6 • Online meeting with parents/carers and schools at the end of the six weeks where observations, suggested strategies, progress steps and recommendations are discussed. Schools can help by providing us with the following: • The name and email of those that are to receive reports and documentation • A designated space to work in each session. If this is not provided, we will be unable to conduct the sessions. The dates below indicate when the DSPL 6 referral panel will meet to discuss cases and allocate provision for Outreach and InReach. The panels include the HIVE Leader, the DSPL 6 Area Manager and SEND lead, local Headteachers, SENCO's, Pastoral Leads, Schools Statutory Exclusion team, other colleagues and professionals. Wednesday 25 th November 2026 for Spring term	Wednesday 10 th March 2027 for Summer term	Wednesday 23 rd June 2027 for Autumn term	How it will look: HIVE InReach support is a short-term schooling option based at HIVE for pupils whom need a more specific and intensified level of support for SEMH needs. How it will look: • Dual registration between mainstream school and HIVE • KS1 and KS2 pupils • Spaces are allocated by need and group dynamics. • Attendance at HIVE varies on the pupil and the allocated days and times. Not full-time placement in HIVE. • Usually 12-week/one term placement • Holistic support based on identified needs from EHCPs, risk assessments, behaviour support plans, referral forms, school and parent information and HIVE observations. • Routine of learning • Continued safeguarding visits from schools to HIVE • NEW - Set coaching sessions for school staff embed supportive strategies used in HIVE • Prior to InReach commencing contact dates and times between mainstream school, identified pupil and HIVE will be timetabled. • Mid-placement review meetings • HIVE teachers will meet with mainstream schools prior to placement commencement. • Prior to accessing InReach support HIVE team meet school representatives, pupil, parents through an onsite visit to discuss arrangements, set up start dates, and other administrative considerations. • End of Provision meetings with schools and families. • End of Provision reports <u>Attendance for InReach</u> Pupils will need to attend sessions regularly otherwise the number of sessions offered maybe limited or withdrawn due to high demand for spaces. 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<u>Targeted plus</u> <u>HIVE InReach – Short-term schooling placement</u>	<u>Specialist</u> <u>HIVE InReach placement</u>	<u>Other</u>
NEW – From Spring 2027 HIVE will offer BEE-HIVE sessions on a Friday morning. B- Belong E – Engage E – Empower These sessions will replace the previous onsite reintegration sessions on a Tuesday morning. BEE-HIVE mornings are to support the reintegration of pupils back into their mainstream settings with the opportunity to have continued HIVE support during this process. BEE-HIVE mornings will also be an opportunity for a re-connect for pupils who have previously had HIVE InReach support and may need some resettling sessions. More information will be sent nearer the time. NEW – From Autumn 2026 HIVE are introducing parent/carer and child engagement sessions. We value the partnership between parents/carers and HIVE and will be supporting valued interactions and communications through fun and collaborative sessions.	<u>Managed Move Pupils</u> HIVE will work closely with the Statutory Schools Exclusions Team, DSPL 6 manager and DSPL 6 schools to support pupils and schools with managed moves where able. This support may include: • Attending professional’s meetings • A short-term placement in HIVE InReach • OutReach support (from Spring 2027) • Access to BEE-HIVE sessions <u>6th Day Provision</u> HIVE may offer alternative provision for those pupils who have been subject to a permanent exclusion if appropriate. This agreement covers primary aged children resident in DSPL 6. HIVE will work closely with the Statutory Schools Exclusions Team, DSPL 6 manager and DSPL 6 schools to support both KS1 and KS2 pupils through onsite and remote provision HIVE will host the pupil until the Governors Exclusion Hearing.	<u>Specialist Plus – other provision</u> Some pupils will need greater intensive support than HIVE can offer and may need a special school place. Specialist provision will be for pupils who have been identified by various professionals as having complex, persistent and enduring SEMH needs. HIVE do not host pupils awaiting specialist provision placement. <u>Outreach and InReach</u> For support to commence HIVE will need to receive a consent and service level agreement included on the referral forms that is signed by schools and parents/carers. Without this support cannot begin. HIVE will support with: • EHCP applications and advice • FIF cases • Risk assessments • Professional meetings • TAF meetings • Safeguarding meetings including CIN/CP/CLA meetings <u>Other agencies</u> HIVE will liaise with other DSPL 6 agencies who are also supporting individual pupil cases. <u>Assess, Plan, Do Review</u> Schools are now asked to take time to embed all Solution Cluster and HIVE advice through their APDR processes. Therefore, cases brought to Solution Cluster would not be expected to be referred for HIVE OutReach the following week.
