HIVE OutReach

HIVE Outreach will work with pupils and schools to develop understanding and acknowledgement of feelings and behaviours, through shared strategies and knowledge, enabling pupils to be successful within their setting.



HIVE InReach

HIVE InReach offers pupils access to a balanced academic and nurturing curriculum across their short-term schooling placement supporting their behaviour development in order for them to return to their mainstream settings with greater self-esteem, social skills, confidence and a more positive role within their school community.

Introduction

HIVE is the DSPL 6 Primary Behaviour Provision which offers early intervention by experienced staff to support the Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs, including behaviour, for pupils, their families and local schools. The Tiered Approach of support that HIVE follow aligns to the Hertfordshire Emotional, Wellbeing and Behaviour Strategy, with outreach support at Tiers 3 and InReach provision at Tiers 4 and 5.

HIVE supports the six outcomes for pupils identified by Hertfordshire. Each outcome means many different things depending on the individual pupils and their families we are support.



Tiered approach for support

Universal and Universal Plus (Tier 1 and 2)

Individual School's responsibilities to meet SEND need within the mainstream school.

HIVE host the **DSPL 6 Solution Clusters** – This offers solution focused reflective practise for Year 1-6 pupil/s within a mainstream school. It happens every half term and is conducted online with access to advice from a variety of local professionals.

Targeted support (Tier 3)

Individual School's responsibilities to offer some children more targeted support within a mainstream school.

Some pupils' may need help from outside agencies.

For children, Year 1-6, who need something more individual to meet their needs, as well as support from outside agencies there is: **HIVE Outreach support**; six sessions of provision. Small group or individual.

Observation, advice and strategies slots regarding individuals, small groups or whole classes.

Targeted Plus (Tier 4)

Those children, Year 1-6 who need intensive support in a smaller environment for a short period. **HIVE InReach short-term schooling**; usually twelve weeks.

Specialist (Tier 5)

For pupils where a managed move instead of permanent exclusion is sought. Also provision from Day 6 in cases of permanent exclusion until the Governors Discretionary Committee hearing there is:

HIVE InReach placement.

Additional support 2025-2026

NEW – HIVE Reception aged pupils consultation mornings Time to speak with the HIVE team about a pupil/s who are demonstrating behaviours that challenge.

Solutions Clusters are attended by a number of professionals who are able to offer advice, strategies and signposting as early intervention to best support the pupil/s case who has been presented. <p>How it will look:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In person meeting with parents/carers and schools prior to support beginning where an agreed target or areas for support are discussed. Support will begin with an in class session from the behaviour support worker observing the pupils communications, interactions and behaviour. Individual sessions will be planned and delivered. Building capacity for individual pupils, parents and schools through plans, observations, advice and strategies on site and weekly feedback with responsibilities for schools and parents to implement. This will usually be 6 sessions of support. Support available for pupils Yr. 1 to 6 Online meeting with parents/carers and schools at the end of the six weeks where observations, suggested strategies, progress steps and recommendations are discussed. <p>Schools can help by providing us with the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The name and email of those that are to receive reports and documentation A designated space to work in each session. The group dynamic has been analysed by the school prior to referral. The group is for those children that you would not consider needing HIVE outreach individual intervention yet and may have a particular need in common with others that can be addressed through a small group intervention. Some interventions will ask for the school to provide an additional adult for part of the intervention in order to follow up or embed activities. This in turn will help to build capacity within your own school setting. Building capacity for individual pupils, parents and schools through plans, observations, advice and strategies on site and weekly feedback with responsibilities for schools and parents to implement. This will be 6 sessions of support. This agreement covers primary aged children resident in DSPL 6. HIVE will work closely with the Statutory Schools Exclusions Team, DSPL 6 manager and DSPL 6 schools to support both KS1 and KS2 pupils through onsite and remote provision</p> <p>HIVE will host the pupil until the Governors Exclusion Hearing.</p> <p>HIVE will support with reintegration into identified provision, where possible, (unless it is a special provision).</p>

<p><u>Specialist Plus – other provision</u> Some pupils will need greater intensive support than HIVE can offer and may need a special school place. Specialist provision will be for pupils who have been identified by various professionals as having complex, persistent and enduring SEMH needs.</p> <p>HIVE do not host pupils awaiting specialist provision placement.</p> <p><u>Outreach and InReach</u> For support to commence HIVE will need to receive a consent and service level agreement included on the referral forms that is signed by schools and parents/carers. Without this support cannot begin.</p> <p>HIVE will support with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • EHCP applications and advice • LHNF applications • Therapeutic paperwork • Professional meetings • TAF meetings • CIN/CP meetings <p><u>Other agencies</u> HIVE will liaise with other DSPL 6 agencies who are also supporting individual pupil cases.</p> <p><u>Assess, Plan, Do Review</u> Schools are now asked to take time to embed all Solution Cluster and HIVE advice through their APDR processes.
